### TED TALK LEARNING AND PRACTICE

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For this first day of the project, we had at our disposal two students from the 1st Bac Pro. We started by presenting the project of these two days, namely the use and knowledge of the Ted Talk site. The goal is to create a filmed lecture on the topic of Fake News:

- What is Fake News?
- How do we recognize them?
- How do we solve them?

For this, we launched the students on a work of synthesis, which was to serve as a basis for their presentation. So they listed in a table arguments and examples:

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In video, we attended and participated in activities on communication, followed by some examples of Ted Talk by foreign partners. Not being in Bulgaria, we carried out these exercises remotely. This was to list all the do's and don'ts in communication:

Then we attended a presentation on cyber attacks and the presentation of a video editing application: Render Forest.

During the first afternoon, the students then constructed the subject of their Ted Talk, before translating it into English.
